Anne-Marie Cade is a Lawyer, Nationally Accredited Mediator, Family Dispute Resolution Practitioner, Conflict Resolution Specialist, Parenting Co-ordinator, Speaker, Trainer, Local Government Councillor and Lecturer in law. She was awarded a Churchill Fellowship to conduct research internationally in 16 cities in 7 countries to investigate "Best Practice in Parenting Co-ordination" to inform the implementation of the practice in Australia. Parenting Coordination is an alternative method of disputer resolution where a parenting coordination assists parents navigate interparental conflict post separation. In the course of her research she studied parenting coordination practices, the development of legislation, ethical considerations of the practice as well as methods of navigating and managing conflict effectively.

She is passionate about providing insights and strategic advice on building conflict intelligence, constructive conflict resolution, conflict management and navigating difficult conversations with Corporate Teams, Local Government, State Government, Elected Officials and Lawyers.
