

Expression of interest in becoming a mentor

## 1. Background

ALGWA Vic has received funding from the Victorian Government to establish a mentoring program targeting new female councillors following the 2020 local government election.

The 2020 Mentoring Program follows on from the successful 2016 ALGWA Vic Mentoring Program. This opportunity enabled 20 new local government female councillors to be matched with 20 experienced current or former councillors from metropolitan, regional and rural Victorian municipalities.

As a result of the successful implementation of the mentoring program in 2016, this program will continue to allow new female councillors in 2020 mentorship according to need, location and the interests with 20 trained mentors.

All program participants will receive a copy of The Mentoring Handbook - encouraging and supporting women local government councillors, which includes case studies and insightful guidance regarding effective and empowering mentorship.

The program is co-ordinated and actively monitored by Leonie Morgan AM and associate Linda Bennett. Both Leonie and Linda have over 20 years of experience in establishing and implementing political mentoring programs conducted for women in local government. Should any issues arise within the mentoring matches, Leonie or Linda will be available to assist.

## 2. What is Mentoring?

- Mentoring is when a more experienced person assists a generally less experienced person in a specific area of expertise to advance in their chosen pursuit - this could be in business, in politics or in any other area of life.
- Mentoring in a political context like local government is very different from business mentoring
  as there are many other issues involved, such as working with others who may have different
  political views, managing your new role in the community, technical aspects of how local
  government works, etc.
- Mentors are generally more experienced in campaigning and in local government. They are
  experienced councillors and are willing to assist someone with less experience to gain skills
  to become better councillors.
- Those who are mentored are generally less experienced and are seeking assistance in developing their local government careers.

### 3. The ALGWA Vic Mentoring Program

### How will the ALGWA Vic Mentoring Program work?

Following the 2020 local government elections, ALGWA Vic will write to all the newly elected female councillors to ask if they would like the support of an experienced female councillor or excouncillor as a mentor. Of those who express interest (mentees), 20 will each be matched with one of the 20 experienced female councillors as a mentor, according to needs, location and interests.

All participants must be members of ALGWA Vic.

#### Who are the mentors?

ALGWA Vic is inviting expressions of interest in being a mentor from a diverse selection of experienced female councillors including former councillors. 20 individuals who express their interest will be selected as mentors for newly elected female councillors.

### What support will be provided to mentors?

Mentors will be offered a two-hour training session. This will be offered by Zoom or face-to-face in Melbourne and in one regional Victorian location. Mentors and mentees will also be provided with the 2020 Mentoring Handbook. The program consultant, Leonie Morgan, will be available by email leoniejm@bigpond.net.au should questions arise.

### What might be the focus of the Mentoring Discussions?

The specific focus of each mentoring arrangement will be discussed at the first meeting between the mentor and mentee (newly elected female councillors). It is anticipated that discussions will focus on issues that arise in local government. This could include:

- How to work with other councillors, and use your power and authority effectively.
- How to work with the council officers.
- How to manage your councillor time more effectively.
- How to balance work as a councillor with the other responsibilities in your life.
- How to keep in contact with constituents to fulfil your role.

### How long will the Mentoring Support be provided?

Following matching of mentors to mentees, the formal mentoring program will run till the end of 2021 when there will be an evaluation. However, experience with the 2016 ALGWA Vic Mentoring Program indicates that informal mentoring often continues between Program participants.

### How will mentors make contact with the mentees?

Once each mentor is matched with a mentee, they will be provided with phone and email contact details. Each mentor will then contact their mentee. Ongoing contact might be made by phone, email, Zoom, Skype or Messenger. They may also meet in person if they both feel this is useful. Experience with the 2016 program indicates that at least one in person meeting is valuable at the beginning of the partnership.

#### How often will mentors make contact with the mentees?

Contact would be made on a fortnightly or monthly basis. The program offers flexible contact to suit the needs of both the mentor and mentee.

### What happens if there's a problem?

If there's a problem, the ALGWA Vic Executive Officer Cr Michelle Kleinert or the Program Consultant Leonie Morgan will be available to answer questions or queries to sort out any difficulties. Leonie will also be in contact with each mentor periodically to see that things are going well.

## 4. Are you Interested in Mentoring a Newly Elected Female Councillor?

- Are you an ALGWA Vic member or life member?
- Are you an experienced female councillor or former councillor?
- Are you interested and knowledgeable about the particular issues that impact on women in the community and in politics?
