A former Councillor at the Nillumbik Shire Council from 2004 to 2016 and two



The rest is history 10 years on, and with a partnership with the VLGA along the way, ALGWA Vic wants to continue the tradition.

This year ALGWA Vic will host a Deputy Mayor Forum for the first time to share and encourage the next step in a leadership role.

This event is for Deputy Mayors to share some inspiring words, share challenges and experiences. It is a stepping stone to the role of Mayor, so how are you going with that?
